## Sooke River Bluegrass Music Festival

The Sooke River Bluegrass Festival celebrates 10 years of foot-stomping fun June 18, 19 and 20. Held every year at the Sooke River Campground, the event is family friendly and features a wide range of local and imported talent.

This year a new board brings fresh energy to the festival. President and Festival Manager Phil Shaver, virtuosic guitar player with Four Chords of Wood, says this festival has something for everyone. "We've worked hard to schedule top Canadian groups like the Spinney Brothers," he says, "but offer lots of local talent as well". Well-known local groups include: Four Chords of Wood, the Clover Point Drifters, Skagway, Last Train and Flash in the Pan. James Whittall and Dave Clarke offer instrumental magic on the guitar and mandolin. Frosty Hollow is a family band from Washington State that delivers a lively old-timey mix of tunes.

This year the camping facilities have been updated with new washrooms and showers. And no more frosty fingers! Phil promises that a large circus tent will keep late night jammers warm and cosy. "It's the same great festival with a few improvements," says Phil.

The Coombs Bluegrass Festival is celebrating their 32nd year and is the oldest bluegrass festival in B.C.! While still the same great festival with a strong support and volunteer base on the island and further afield, festival organizer Linda Thorburn has seen some exciting changes in the last couple years. Spring and fall concert series have been a big hit, with an open mic setting the stage for bands like Skagway, the Foggy Hometown Boys, Flash in the Pan, CornerGrass, Riverside Trio, The Clover Point Drifters, and many others. This year, festival goers can look forward to a full program right through Sunday, with a brand new Band Scramble, a banjo workshop with Roger Matthews on Sunday afternoon, instrument and bluegrass package draws, and the Biggest Bluegrass Band in B.C.! Not to mention a great line-up of 12 bands starting on Friday, including Midnight Flight (Missouri), 5 on a String, the Clover Point Drifters, Last Train, and Flash in the Pan - and at least 13 random acts of bluegrass throughout Sunday, starting with 2 gospel acts in the morning.

Future festival plans include a 2011 Coombs Bluegrass Music Camp the Tuesday to Friday after the festival, and as always, great bluegrass and old-time music.
