# Workshop - 5-String Banjo with Nick Hornbuckle

In this course, Nick will cover ideas and techniques used to create solos for tunes and songs. Using his proven method, Nick will guide you through the steps of taking a basic melody and turning it into a great Bluegrass solo. We will focus on playing a few well known melodies in open G, also in the up the neck second position G, and finally in the Key of C in the first position. We will also cover basic back up concepts, and use them in the songs we learn. Students should bring a recording device, and tablature will be available.

Nick Hornbuckle has been playing the banjo for 35 years, and teaching for 30. He has taught at several music camps in Canada and the US including Rockygrass, the California Bluegrass Camp, Wintergrass, the 108 Mile Music Camp, the Alaska Bluegrass Cruise, and the BCBW. Nick has been featured in Banjo Newsletter, and has published three banjo instruction books. Nick tours and records with the Juno nominated Bluegrass band, John Reischman and the Jaybirds." Workshop will be held at a location that will be made available to those who register.

# **Letter from Band Camp**

Kathleen Law, the 2010 VBA Bursary winner for the British Columbia Bluegrass Workshop, lets us know how things went in Sorrento:

"Two weeks shy from a full year in Victoria, I look back upon my experiences feeling that I've grown as a musician and person. The culmination of this time was two weeks of sustained bliss at the British Columbia Bluegrass Workshops, in Sorrento. I am still



excited about all twelve tunes Sammy Lind passed on to us in his Old Time fiddle class and I am grateful for Dave Keenan's Intermediate flatpicking class, in which he distilled over 20 years of playing into a four-day lesson on the fundamental patterns governing the guitar neck.

I learned a lot in those two weeks that flew by so quickly. I learned the importance of taking naps if you want to be able to jam at night and make it to your morning class the next day. But more importantly, I witnessed a community built around a shared passion for playing music come together to learn and celebrate. It is that same community which so graciously welcomed me last fall, and through which I've grown as a musician and made friendships that will last for many years to come. It is with profound gratitude that I want to express my thanks and appreciation to all VBA members and volunteers who made it possible for me to attend Sorrento as one of two 2010 Bursary winners. I leave with Garret Tompson, also a past VBA Sorrento Bursary recipient, on October 10th, headed for my new hometown of Toronto (don't worry, Garrett will be back!). We'll be playing guitar and fiddle all the way across the country through Via Rail's 'entertainment in exchange for transport' program, and contributing to the bluegrass epidemic which is sweeping the nation."

If you are 25 or younger, a current member of the VBA, have never been to the BCBW, and would like to improve on your instrument(s), spend a week on a property with 150 people learning, playing, jamming, swimming...then we encourage you to apply for the VBA's 2010 Scholarship.
